

SICILIAN-born barber Frank Vaiana (pictured front centre) knew something was afoot when he stepped out of his Vardon Ave shop on Tuesday afternoon to the sounds of the *Godfather* theme song. "The godfathers are here today of every nationality and persuasion," announced his landlord **Theo Maras**, as Frank's family, friends and clients held a surprise party to celebrate his 50th year as a hairdresser in the East End. Ever the professional, Frank's first thought was "what happened to the customer I left in the chair?" A happy Frank then confessed to well-wishers: "You've done a pretty good job of making tears in my eyes. I'm very happy to see all of you here ... when I came to this city, I had plenty of hair, I was young, I was innocent – look at me now." Frank's wife Mary says the celebrations were actually a few days early, as he started working in the East End on December 9, 1957, after arriving in Australia that September. 3-day Vic Pk Foley decree

THE State Government has slapped a three-day ultimatum – expiring today – on the City Council to provide alternative grandstand plans for Victoria Park.

A hastily called second City Council meeting this week voted on compromise lease conditions — as long as the grandstand is relocated to Vic Park's Fullarton Rd boundary. "I'm disappointed the deputy premier has again held a gun to this council's head," chief grandstand critic Cr David Plumridge said before voting for the compromise.

Cr Joe Cullen said "I'll be crucified for this" before voting against it.
