Time to change drinking age law

SAFETY AFTER DARK

CITIZENS' JURY SUBMISSIONS

RAISING the legal drinking age, introducing minimum alcohol pricing and restricting the number of liquor outlets are some of the ideas put forward by the Attorney General's Department to help reduce alcohol-related violence in the city.

A group of senior department officials has raised the "evidence-based" ideas in a submission to the state's new Citizens' Jury. The jury, which has met for the

first time, is made up of 43 randomly selected people. The jury is charged with making recommendations to the State Government about how to create safe and vibrant night-life in Adelaide's CBD.

Department officials said in a submission that raising the drinking age and strictly enforcing these laws "can have a substantial effect among young people and alcohol-related harm."
